What is JSURP – Japan Society of Urban and Regional Planners



It is a certified non-profit organization (NPO).

The purpose is to contribute to the development of MACHIZUKURI- Community Development/Enrichment, by providing knowledge and experience.

JSURP was established in 1993, became incorporated as a non-profit organization in 2001, and was certified in 2014. It holds app. 400 members as of Dec. 2024.

The organization holds diverse group of members - experts in urban planning from the fields of academics, consultants, and local governments, and is actively contributing to the development of "MACHIDUKURI" throughout Japan.

Note: "Machizukuri" is a commonly used Japanese term which includes variety of meaning such as community development, revitalization, restoration, planning etc. It usually holds implication of citizen/local participation.

 - □ Delivery lectures for local government officials: Staff training that incorporates lectures and discussions on specific topics (e.g., policy making for community development etc.).
 - □ Placemaking Workshop : Short-term practice in placemaking and workshops for implementation.

2 Activities as an Intermediate Support Organization

- We provide support as an intermediary support organization to community development partners that are engaged in self-governed and public interest activities in various regions.

3 Support for Restoration after Disaster

- In the area of damaged by disaster, JSURP has formed a task force since the Niigata Chuetsu-oki Earthquake to support restoration and community redevelopment. For community, JSURP provides various support, guiding the direction of restoration suited to the local community in collaboration with the local people.
- In addition, to ensure prompt and accurate action after disaster, we are developing human resources and building a system for restoration and community revitalization, in preparation for largescale disasters.

■ Achievements **■**

• In 2022, we conducted in Machizukuri Workshop in Chigasaki City. As a result of our Task Force action, which consisted mainly of young members, a support team was formed for recovery, which has become a model for future organization.

■ Future Task **■**

 We aim to continue our activities nationwide, to create a support system and increase the social ability to promptly take necessary actions after a disaster.





4 Japan MACHIDUKURI Annual Assembly (JMA)

- JMA started in 2005 at Hibiya Public Hall and Kogakuin University in Tokyo. It is a place where citizens and organizations engaged in community development throughout Japan come together to deepen their connections and collaborations.
- In 2020-2021, due to COVID, seven online sessions were conducted and in Nov. 2021 an in-person session was held in Ofunato, Iwate Prefecture.
- In 2022, it was held in-person at Chiba University Sumida Satellite Campus in Tokyo; in 2023, at Meiji University Surugadai Campus in Tokyo; and in 2024, at Endoji Shopping Street in Nagoya City.

5 Urban Planner's Vision 2024

- The Forum Committee has held symposiums and sessions on themes related to urban planning such as Master Plans, and the new theme such as public space utilization and area management.
- Based on two years of discussion, "Urban Planner's Vision 2024" as JSURP was released in December 2024.

6 Activities with Escape Route/Time Map (ERM)

- The ERM is a routes map of color-coded by 5 colors green, yellow-green, yellow, orange, and red, for every three minutes of evacuation time to the target point, based on the walking time of elderly people.
- It was developed by the volunteers in the Nikken Sekkei Architects, based on the experience of the Great East Japan Earthquake. Workshops have been held in more than 50 communities and schools throughout Japan.
- In 2023, the ERM Committee was established as one of the research committee JSURP. About 50 members from the Nikken Sekkei, other private companies, urban planners and university researchers are participating.

■ Achievements **■**

- ERM members collaborated and held ERM making workshops in six districts across Japan in 2024, as well as training sessions to learn ERM making techniques.
- JSURP has inherited various manuals and archives of the research results of the Escape Map Project team and are building a website for the ERM with the help of corporate sponsorship, which will soon be open to the public.

■ Future Task ■

• In order to have more people involved in making ERM, JSURP has established a system to certify and register "ERM experts". It will further promote disaster-resistant community by using ERM, in collaboration with more sponsors/partners.







7 Local Activities

- JSURP has members and local chapters throughout Japan. The local chapters are engaged in various local activities. New chapters have been established in Hiroshima in 2022 and in Shakotan in 2023.
- Activities such as J's Cafe, Walking Tours and various symposiums are held, thus building a network of community development partners/ planners.

8 Training for Planners

■ Achievement ■

- In 2015, JSURP began "Machizukuri College" for local government, private sector, consultants, students, etc.
- A wide range of themes have been chosen, including the basics of urban planning, placemaking, area management, transportation/mobility, and community care for an aging society.
- A total of more than 20 courses have been held and more than 500 people participated.



■ Future Task **■**

- We are considering developing the program to more focused on the training for young planners.
- We will make a platform for basic learning on urban planning and community development.
